






Wind Power Worldwide [MW]

What is Community Power



Local stakeholders **own** a majority share

Majority of social and economic benefits are distributed locally

Voting control rests with a community-based organisation

"A local individual or a group of local stakeholders, whether they are farmers, cooperatives, independent power producers, financial institutions, municipalities, schools, etc., own, immediately or eventually, the majority or all of a project."



Community Power is mainstream in some countries



Community Power is diverse!

Small – medium – large – solar – wind – self-supply – energy sharing – PPAs – cooperatives – corporations – rural – urban – industrialised countries – "developing countries" – energy access – gender balance – etc



Community Power accelerates the switch to renewable energy



A bottleneck:

Planning processes of wind farms

Global average duration:

62 months for planning process 29 months for permitting process



Recommendations

- The **permitting process should not take longer than 12 months**, so that a decision must be made no later than one year after the submission of a wind farm building application. Greater **standardisation of the approval procedures** will help to shorten their duration.
- Strengthen social support for wind power by fostering models which
 maximise the local share of economic and social benefits with local
 communities, municipalities and citizens. Local involvement in the
 planning process and local (co-)ownership of wind farms are important
 instruments to achieve not only high local acceptance, but local
 support.
- Each country should set up a monitoring process which assesses wind power planning and permit- ting processes on a regular basis and identifies areas of improvement, as far as necessary also on a state/province level in order to identify more specific barriers.



What policies are good for Community Power

Most important: Non-discriminatory!

Auctions are not inclusive!






White Paper: Community Energy Benefits


